Personal Statement Instructions

Your personal statement will be used to assess your ability to write at the graduate level by addressing the topics in a cohesive, integrated essay, as well as your readiness for graduate education. Your personal statement should fully inform the committee about your view of yourself as a quality candidate for professional social work education. Care should be taken in its preparation.

This narrative essay must be doubled-spaced, typewritten, a minimum of two (2) pages long and a maximum of three (3) pages long. Please answer the following prompts/questions:

- 1. Please share with us about your educational and professional background and how that has influenced your desire to pursue a Master's in Social Work (MSW) degree.
- 2. What are your short-term and long-term career goals? How will an MSW degree help you achieve those goals?
- 3. What personal and professional strengths do you believe will contribute to your success in the MSW program?
- 4. Please share any areas for growth you currently identify.
- 5. What experience have you had with oppressed populations (racial, ethnic, sexual orientation, persons with disabilities, religion, etc.)? How has that experience influenced you and your decision to pursue a Master's in Social Work?
- 6. Please discuss the number of hours a week you plan to devote to your graduate studies and how you plan to make time to complete the required internships. (Internships usually require between 20-25 hours per week).
